 Two-story brick duplex
 5 beds /operating room/nursery
 X-ray machine
 “a hospital is much needed in Kinsley”
 “does not dispense drugs, uses prescription method
 Nurse on duty at all times

1950 **720 E. Fifth Street** **Edwards County Hospital**
 Administered by Lutheran Hospital Association
 Original board: Chester Bidleman, Mrs. Alice Slentz, Leo Craft,
 Lee Parker, and Harry Johnston
 21 employees
 3 physicians: Dr. W. Lynn McKim, Dr. M. Dale Atwood,
 Dr. Rene E. Schnoebelen.

1953 Edwards County Hospital has been self-sustaining in the 3 year period of its operation
 Average number of patients per day was 14 (often 25 patients in hospital to get average)
 Average stay was 5.63 days –lower than 6.01 at the time at other facilities

8/6/1953 Edwards County Hospital
 Lutheran Hospital Association still administering hospital
 Addition to hospital bringing it up to 35 beds

3/17/1960 Edwards County Hospital
 New wing and extensive remodeling
 43 employees

From 1950 to 1960: 905 babies were born with 10 sets of twins. Admissions were 7680 with 4227 people receiving care. 8497 outpatients with an average of 59 per month in 1950 and 121 in 1960.
